Karin Mulligan Scholarship Scheme

Karin Mulligan was one of Britain's most senior Black police women who died in March 2009 after losing her battle with cancer.

Karin was an exemplary police officer who challenged injustice and discrimination wherever she found it, she earned and deserved the respect and admiration of many, especially the NBPA. Karin was a 'pioneer' for "Black" women in the police, she died just minutes after being presented with a 'Policing Excellence Award' from the National Black Police Association.

The Scholarship scheme operates through the NBPA charity and contributes to the development of members of the community, police officers and police staff completing academic study or personal development mainly linked to policing.
